**ALICE REPORT: JUNE 2019** 

- ALICE is an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed.
- The goal of the ALICE report is to raise awareness about the number of individuals and families that are living paycheck to paycheck and only one emergency away from financial crisis.





- United Way of PA and 31 local United Ways have been working to help bring awareness that 37% of Pennsylvania households are struggling to survive.
- From 2016 to 2026 most of the fastest growing jobs in Pennsylvania will pay less than \$20 per hour.

# UNITED WAY OF CARLISLE & CUMBERLAND COUNTY 1918 THROUGH 2018 MILESTONES

- 1918 Carlisle creates the Patriotic and Benevolent Fund to support war efforts and sustain local charities. The first fund collected \$36,923 which benefited 18 agencies and funds.
- 1922 The Patriotic and Benevolent Fund becomes the Carlisle Community Chest. Funds designated for war effort were eliminated, and the Carlisle Community Chest was able to receive \$30,016 on their first one week, door-to-door campaign.
- 1960 Carlisle United Fund created to combine multiple appeals for funds in the community.
- 1974 New name is the United Way of the Greater Carlisle Area. Campaign thermometer first appears on the square.
- 1992 First Day of Caring
- 1993 UW celebrates diamond anniversary with a campaign goal of \$1 million
- 1996 Leadership Associates created by Ann Hoffer
- 1998 Local Alexis de Tocqueville Society established by Ray Wolfe
- 1999 Alexis de Tocqueville Humanitarian Award established
- 2000 Success By 6 Initiative created
- 2004 First "Evening for the Children Gala"
- 2005 First U-Turn College & Community Yard Sale
- 2010 First "Fill the Bus" collection event
- 2011 First Glee competition, Taking it to the Streets initiated, and Women's Leadership Council formed
- 2017 First "Born Learning Trail" opened
- 2018 Celebrates 100th anniversary currently providing funding to 25 partner agencies and 39 programs.




### **HOW GIVING WAS DIRECTED IN 2019**
